INVISIBLE ILLNESS WEEK

This coming week, Sep 26-30, will be a first for both HHCS and Muncie. Invisible IllnessAwareness Week is part of Awareness Month for Muncie and Delaware County. The purpose is to raise awareness for those who struggle with illnesses that you would never imagine they were dealing with, and was started largely by Chelsi Christman, who has dystonia.

Chelsi Christman works at Heritage in the elementary after school program and has started this month with the help of Muncie Mayor Dennis Tyler. As we near the end of September, the elementary side will have a main emphasis on this. Each class will be discussing all types of invisible illness from dystonia to depression to diabetes. Also, Chelsi will speak to all the students in chapel. The week will culminate with a lantern/balloon launch on Friday at 10:00 a.m. on the north soccer field. The elementary students will be wearing their blue HHCS polos as blue is the color of invisible illnesses. In fact, city hall is planning on lighting up blue for support.
